Note: It is in your best interest to record all pre-existing damage in detail so that you are not held liable for the cost of repair.
Footpath bays – description of damage (e.g three bays are damaged, two large cracks about 20cms).
Vehicle crossing (driveway) bays – description of damage (e.g one bay damaged, graffiti tag 40cms).
Kerb and channel (gutter) sections – description of damage (e.g three bays are damaged).
Road pavement – description of damage (e.g three bays are damaged).
Nature strip – description of damage (e.g tyre marks).
Street trees – description of damage (e.g one tree damaged, lower limb broken off).
Drainage pits – description of damage (e.g one drainage pit with 10cm crack).
Other assets – other Council assets include: light poles, signs, fire hydrant plugs and service pits.
